



## London Calling Lesson

Here is really simple 45 minute lesson about London. It was made for a Middle school class (age 13-16) and includes a PPT presentation, a worksheet and a lucky wheel game to finish.

### LESSON:

- Go through the London PPT and explain the various sights.
- Mid-way through the PPT there are a couple of videos to watch, you should just need to click them to play them (full-screen) Just press escape to exit full-screen mode.
- Explain the worksheet – students must imagine they are visiting London for one day only. What would they do with £50. Students then choose from the listed items and write a sentence about why they would like to visit that particular thing.
- Play the lucky wheel game – Organise the students into teams (maybe 4 or 5) and explain the rules: Students choose a question by telling you a country (based on flags in the PPT). If they answer the question correctly click on the ✓ and then click *spin* to spin the lucky wheel and see how many points the team gets. Then return to the flags page by clicking the home button. If they get the answer wrong just click the X button to return to the flags page.

The game also includes a couple of other rules which are explained in the Lucky Wheel PPT.

The lesson aims to give a bit of a broader knowledge of London and worked really well for us, particularly the game at the end. The whole lesson could also be adapted to any other city, feel free to mess with the PPTs.
